Alberta

Renewal Period: June 1, 2026 - May 31, 2027

Effective June 2026, the CCOA has introduced a new Continuing Competence Program that no longer requires CCOA to approve seminars for CC credits. Registered chiropractors are now responsible for selecting continuing education activities that align with the College's established rules, standards, and expectations for professional competence. Chiropractors must ensure that any education they undertake for continuing education credit is relevant to their scope of practice and supports safe, ethical, and competent care.

Each D.C. TRACTS issue provides 6 continuing education hours. For questions about any D.C. TRACTS courses, please contact Customer Service at 1-800-342-0454.

No activity may be claimed more than once within a three-year period, and duplicate credit cannot be claimed for the same material presented in different formats. Please check with our Customer Service to verify courses previously completed.

Annual CC requirements

Annually, each chiropractor must complete 24 CC credits including any mandatory requirements. The chiropractor must keep record and evidence of all professional development activities. To qualify for CC credits, an activity must meet the following:

- Relevant to chiropractic practice
- Within the Alberta scope of practice
- Evidence-informed and does not promote non-evidence-informed practices
- Aligned with College Standards, Code of Ethics, and Directives
- Instructor(s) must comply with Alberta Standards and must not promote non-evidence-informed practices

Mandatory requirements

Chiropractors have mandatory requirements due, as part of the current competence cycle. To check your requirements, visit your profile in the Members' Centre and click on the Continuing Competence tab to view your CC Summary. If you need to complete a requirement, it will be listed as "Yes" in the CC Summary. If you do not need to complete a requirement, it will be listed as "No".

British Columbia

Approval Period: Renewals due by March 31st of odd years. (Biennial)

In British Columbia doctors of chiropractic must complete a total of 40 hours every 2 years. **At least 6 of these hours must be in Radiology.** A minimum of 28 of the total 40 hours must be through structured credits.

Registrants are responsible for determining and demonstrating the relevance of the learning experience. The College of Complementary Health Professionals of BC (CCHBC) does not pre-approve events and seminars. The CCHPBC will perform random monitoring. All 40 hours/two years can be completed via distance learning. Each D.C. TRACTS issue is worth 6 continuing education hours. For questions about any D.C. TRACTS courses, please contact Customer Service at 1-800-342-0454.

ATTENTION: The CCHPBC WILL NOT ACCEPT D.C. Tracts Volume 28-2: Musculoskeletal Ultrasound and Its Applications to satisfy the biennial Radiology requirement. However, the course may be used as general structured credits.

Ontario

Approval Period: Renewals due by June 30th of even years. (Biennial)

In Ontario doctors of chiropractic must complete a total of 40 hours every 2 years.

A minimum of 20 of the total 40 hours must be through structured credits.

5 hours need to be on radiology, diagnostic skills or adjusting permitted joints

Registrants are responsible for determining and demonstrating the relevance of the learning experience. The CCO does not pre-approve events and seminars.

All 40 hours/biennial can be completed via distance learning. Each D.C. TRACTS issue is worth 6 continuing education hours. For questions about any D.C. TRACTS courses, please contact Customer Service at 1-800-342-0454.

Structured activities include:

- attending courses, seminars, workshops, presentations, conferences
- participating in interactive Internet courses, seminars, workshops, conferences, webinars
 - participating in correspondence courses
 - participating in clinical rounds
- participating in computer assisted learning

Members must participate in a minimum of 20 hours (out of 40) of structured activities over a two-year period
